

Bradley C. Leibovich, M.D.

Professor of Urology



Bradley C. Leibovich, M.D., is a consultant in the Department of Urology at Mayo Clinic and serves as chair for the Department of Urology. He holds the academic rank of professor of urology through the Mayo Clinic College of Medicine. In 2015, Dr. Leibovich was recognized as the David C. Utz, M.D., Professor of Urology.

Dr. Leibovich received a B.A. in biochemistry from Cornell University and his M.D. from Albany Medical College. He completed an internship in general surgery and a urologic surgery residency at Mayo Graduate School of Medicine. Dr. Leibovich completed a fellowship through Mayo Medical School as the Mayo Foundation Scholar in Urologic Oncology, a

fellowship in urologic oncology through Indiana University Medical Center, and a fellowship in urologic oncology through the UCLA Medical Center. He joined the staff of Mayo Clinic in 2001 and continues his practice in the field of urologic oncology.

Dr. Leibovich's expertise in urologic oncology includes specialization in renal cancer, upper tract urothelial carcinoma, testicular cancer, retroperitoneal sarcoma, and other retroperitoneal tumors. He has written numerous peer-reviewed journal articles, editorials, and abstracts and frequently presents his work at conferences, symposiums, and seminars.

Throughout his training and career Dr. Leibovich has received a number of awards and honors, including the C.R. Bard Urological Award for Excellence in Clinical Urology; the Daggett Trust Prize for Professional Performance and Conduct; and the Andrew C. Novick Award, conferred by the Kidney Cancer Association in recognition of health care professionals who have made significant contributions in urology for the treatment of renal cell carcinoma. Additionally, Dr. Leibovich has been awarded the Excellence in Teaching Recognition by Mayo Medical School, Mayo Clinic College of Medicine; Teacher of the Year, Department of Urology at Mayo Clinic; and Teacher of the Year Hall of Fame through the Mayo Fellows Association. Dr. Leibovich has achieved Bronze Level Certification as a Mayo Clinic Quality Fellow through the Mayo Clinic Quality Academy.

He serves on numerous professional societies and associations, including the American Medical Association, American Urological Association, and National Kidney Cancer Association. Dr. Leibovich is a fellow with the American College of Surgeons and a diplomate of the American Board of Urology.

Dr. Leibovich's educational activities include developing curriculums for the Department of Urology at Mayo Clinic and mentorship appointments for Mayo Clinic residents and fellows. He has served on many Mayo Clinic institutional administrative committees, including Mayo Clinic Cancer Center.
