	That's why Dr. Poland recommends everyone over the age of 6 months get this shot and the protection it offers from the virus and its complications.
Dr. Poland	"It can cause respiratory sinusitis, pneumonia, meningitis."

Dr. Poland	"For diabetics, their diabetes can go out of control."
