	don't wake up, and you try to see if they
	have a pulse either on their neck or their
	wrist, and you don't feel a pulse, an AED
	will be very helpful."
	"Once you turn the AED on, it will give you
	all the instructions step-by-step on how to
	use it properly."
AED Nats	"Remove pad package."
	"The node that come in the AFD restrativity
	"The pads that come in the AED packet will
	also have excellent graphs to show you
	where you need to place the pads on the
	patient's chest."
A ED Nicks	"Attach pad to patient's bare chest."
AED Nats	
	"The only thing you need to do is to
	remember to ask for help, call 911 and get
	the AED."
	"So then the machine will analyze after the
	pads are attached."
	"And it will remind you not to touch the
	patient while it's analyzing."
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AED Nats	"Don't touch patient. Analyzing. Shock
	advised."
	"If shock is advised, the AED will charge
	and this orange button will light up when it's
	time to give the shock. When it's time to
	give the shock, you make sure that no one
	is touching the patient and you press the
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	orange button."
AED Nats	"Shock delivered."
	"Shock was delivered"
AED Nats	"Start CPR."
	" and it will advise you to start CPR. And
	the machine will also tell you how fast you
	should be doing CPR if you follow the audio cues."
AED Nats	"Start CPR. Push to match the tone."
	"Once you start chest compressions, the AED will give you a countdown clock for two minutes and it will again remind you to stop compressions at two minutes, so it can analyze again to see if Dan is a shockable rhythm or not. And the cycle then will start again."
	"I really want people not to be afraid to use it because applying an AED to someone who has collapsed and doesn't have a pulse can actually save their life and save their life in a way that they won't have long-lasting consequences from having collapsed on the floor."
	"You cannot hurt someone by using the AED machine if you follow the audio cues."
